Western Desert Recce Group wins Restoration Award for Dr Lawson's 1942 Chevrolet Truck

The restoration of a Long Range Desert Group Chevrolet Truck, specially constructed as a mobile consulting room/casualty station for the Group's medical officer Dr Lawson has led to the Western Desert Recce Group (WDRG) being announced as a winner of a Restoration Award at the National Transport Trust's (NTT) annual awards. The Award was presented to Gary Wallace of the WDRG by the NTT's Royal Patron, Anne, HRH The Princess Royal at a ceremony held in the Railway Museum at Fawley Hill (www.fawleyhill.co.uk) on 18 September 2023.

The Long Range Desert Group operated during the Second World War behind Italian/German lines in the Egyptian desert and were involved in significant intelligence operations and the creation of logistical bases for other irregular operations. In 1941 the Group recruited Dr Lawson and he and his orderlies set about constructing a special-purpose vehicle to meet their needs. Based on a 15 cwt (hundredweight) Chevrolet CMP truck, the vehicle had demountable bodywork which could be used inside a tent.

NTT Awards Director Paul Brook comments: "The restoration and equipping of this showpiece by the Western Desert Recce Group, based on the painstaking notes of Dr Lawson, now held by the IWM, is a fitting tribute to a remarkable organisation, and it has provided hours of entertainment for its service veteran volunteers. The Group will now use the vehicle to celebrate the exploits of the Western Desert Recce Group and to support disabled ex-servicemen. As such, the Group is a very worthy recipient of a National Transport Trust Restoration Award."
