Martin Southam and Karl Tecklenberg receive Lifetime Achievement Awards

The long-term commitment to the restoration of a Leyland PD3 double deck bus has led to Martin Southam of Glen Parva, Leicestershire and Karl Tecklenberg of Kettering, Northamptonshire receiving Lifetime Achievement Awards at the National Transport Trust's (NTT) annual awards. The Awards were presented to Martin and Karl by the NTT's Royal Patron, Anne, HRH The Princess Royal at a ceremony held in the Railway Museum at Fawley Hill (www.fawleyhill.co.uk) on 18 September 2023.

Leyland PD3 double-decker bus TBC 163 was registered and entered service in Leicester in 1958, staying in service until 1974. After some time out of use it became a driver-training vehicle until in 1981 it was sold and partly converted to a children's Playbus but never used. By 1991 it was free to anyone who would restore it and the Leicester Transport Heritage Trust brought it back to Leicester.

NTT Chairman Stuart Wilkinson comments: "When the Trust acquired the bus it was in a bit of a state to say the least, with rotten bulkheads, most handrails and poles missing or bent, no seats, fluorescent lights cut into the ceiling coving panels, no floor coving, a hole in the upstairs floor above the engine bay to accommodate a slide, missing glazing and a hole in the nearside bodywork where a cupboard had been created to house gas bottles as part of the unfinished play bus conversion. The restoration continued for 26 years, at which point the bus successfully passed its MOT. The only two members of the Trust's restoration team who have been there from beginning to end are our Lifetime Achievement Award winners, Martin Southam and Karl Tecklenberg."
