The Award was presented to Ian by the NTT's Royal Patron, Anne, HRH The Princess Royal at a ceremony held in the Railway Museum at Fawley Hill (www.fawleyhill.co.uk) on 18 September 2023.

Lady Judy McAlpine, President of the National Transport Trust, comments: "Ian is a brilliant artist and past President of the Royal Institute of Painters in Oils who just happens to paint a lot of railway scenes. He has also written and illustrated a series of books about Rachael the Railway Horse, who pulled a railway wagon very similar to the one Ian has himself restored. Sir William McAlpine had enormous respect for Ian as an artist, a preservationist and long-time railway volunteer. It is therefore fitting that he is honoured with a 2023 Sir William McAlpine award."
